At a glance

Performance*

The Fund returned 17.46%, the Index returned 11.89% and the Sector returned 7.84%.

Contributors/detractors

Micron Technology was the primary positive contributor to the fund's performance in the first quarter of 2024, while Adobe was the main detractor.

Outlook

We are excited by AI as a new wave of innovation but mindful of the hype cycle. We remain focused on technology leaders with underappreciated earnings power.

Investment environment

The first quarter of 2024 was very much a continuation of recent trends, with investors remaining optimistic about visibility on a peak in interest rates and a 'soft landing' for the US economy, while also looking positively on the potential tailwinds from artificial intelligence (AI). Having outperformed through 2023, technology equities once again outperformed broader market indices in the first quarter of 2024.

Portfolio review

In the first quarter of 2024, the fund outperformed both its benchmark and peers, with performance driven by stocks with clear AI exposure and tailwinds. Within semiconductors, Micron Technology, NVIDIA and Advanced Micro Devices all contributed positively to the fund's performance.

Micron was increasingly seen as an AI winner given its position in the memory market and NVIDIA's results showed sustained momentum with its GPU chips remaining key components for AI infrastructure build-outs. Amazon also performed strongly on the back of robust results and continued AI tailwinds, with public cloud momentum expected to continue to benefit from more normalised optimisation activity and AI advancements.

The fund's holdings in Adobe detracted from performance in the first quarter, mainly due to the emergence of OpenAl's Sora text-to-video model that was seen as a new threat to Adobe's Premiere solution, which is a leading technology for non-linear video editing.

In terms of activity, we added new positions in Applied Materials and Mobileye and exited Keysight, Ambarella and Infineon Technologies. Applied Materials is a leading semiconductor equipment vendor with a strong position in deposition and etching; with demand drivers for silicon broadening and capital intensity increasing, we believe Applied Materials should be well placed. Mobileye leads the market in front-camera advanced driver assistance systems (ADAS) and is well positioned moving towards fully autonomous driving. We exited Keysight Technologies based on concerns around earnings visibility into its first-quarter results and the outlook for the rest of 2024.

We exited Ambarella where the risk reward looked more attractive on other semiconductor names, having just added to Mobileye and Applied Materials. Finally, we also exited the fund's position in Infineon Technologies, which has lagged over the year to date, in part due to its automotive market exposure, to focus on other semiconductor holdings with more earnings upside.

Manager outlook

We are excited to be at the start of another great wave of

technology innovation and see a very favourable environment for active stock pickers ahead.

While still in its early innings, we believe the new AI compute wave can deliver significant productivity gains to the economy and to companies, driving lower inflation and profit growth.

While there will likely be volatility around inventory cycles and lagged effects of interest rate rises, we believe our investments around our key themes of next-generation infrastructure (compute, networking and cloud platforms), electrification and resource and productivity optimisation platforms are very well positioned. Digital advertising has been one of the first areas to show benefits from Al deployments, while fintech is an area that was neglected in 2023 but where we see opportunities that are not being fully appreciated yet.

It will take years rather than months for all of the benefits of AI to come to fruition; therefore, it may take time for the

beneficiaries of AI development to become more apparent to investors. We are wary of extrapolating early adoption in a parabolic manner but equally recognise the significant opportunity ahead as AI enables the technology sector to disrupt more of the old economy.

Given our experience in navigating prior compute waves, we remain focused on sustainable barriers to entry, incorporate environmental, social and governance (ESG) insights and rely on our valuation discipline to guide us in identifying those companies that will become, or will remain, global technology leaders.

The technology sector benefits from one of the strongest tailwinds in the equity market, but with more macroeconomic turbulence still likely, we believe experienced investment 'co-pilots' with proven navigation skills are needed to help chart a smoother path to achieve investors' risk and return objectives.

Investment policy

The Fund invests at least 90% of its assets in a portfolio of shares (equities) and equity-related securities of companies, of any size, which are technology-related or derive profits from technology, in any country. The portfolio may be concentrated in terms of its number of holdings and/or the size of its largest holdings. The Fund may also invest in other assets including investment grade government bonds, cash and money market instruments. The Investment Manager may use derivatives (complex financial instruments) to reduce risk or to manage the Fund more efficiently. The Fund is actively managed with reference to the MSCI ACWI Information Technology Index + MSCI ACWI Communication Services Index (together the "Index"), which is broadly representative of the companies in which it may invest, as this forms the basis of the Fund's performance target and the level above which performance fees may be charged (if applicable). The Investment Manager has discretion to choose investments for the Fund with weightings that may be different to the index or not in the Index, which may result in material differences in performance between the Fund and the Index.

Investment strategy

The strategy is based on identifying companies that are considered by the Investment Manager to be current or future leaders in driving or enabling technology adoption and as such have undiscovered potential for sustained earnings growth. These companies are typically aligned with themes that drive long-term technology growth trends (e.g. internet transformation, next generation infrastructure and payment digitisation). The Investment Manager looks to navigate the hype cycle (different stages in the development of a technology from conception to widespread adoption) by assessing the company's fundamental business model and actively engaging with management on key issues and characteristics relating to all aspects of growth.

Fund specific risks
